

RADIO LIBERTY SCRIPT

I suggest you pray before you begin calling, and ask God for His guidance and protection.

Please don't argue with people or force your opinions on them, always be courteous.

Start with any family or friends you may not have contacted about Radio Liberty. Then you can choose the names of people you are going to call from the telephone book in alphabetic order, and begin with the first letter of your last name. If you encounter people who say they have been contacted, apologize, and proceed to the next letter in the alphabet.

You should listen to Radio Liberty, you can hear the programs 24 hours a day on a computer, I-phone, I-pod, or similar device at www.radioliberty.com, that's www.radioliberty.com.

You can also hear the program 24 hours a day by telephone at 760-569-7711, that's 760-569-7711 (760-LOW-SS11).

If you have a KU Band satellite, you can hear the program 9 hours a day on Galaxy 19.

If you have a shortwave radio, you can hear Radio Liberty 3 hours a day.

If there is a local radio outlet in your area you can say: **and you can hear the program locally on _____** (give them the call letters of the station, the frequency and time the program is broadcast.)
